Dear BLM Management Team:

On behalf of Crescent Peak Renewables, LLC (CPR), this email is to inform the Bureau of Land Management that Eolus North America, Inc is willing to make the following changes to the Plan of Development for the proposed Crescent Peak Wind (CPW) Project that would be located approximately 10 miles west of Searchlight, Nevada.

1. **Lighting Control System to minimize impact of lighting required by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA):** Crescent Peak Renewables is willing to commit to installing an Aircraft Detection Lighting System (ADLS) in conjunction with the Crescent Peak Wind Project. An ADLS will reduce the lighting impact on nearby communities by 95% or more by only activating the project FAA obstruction lighting when aircraft are in the immediate vicinity of the project. This ADLS would be an FAA approved system that provides a high level of aircraft safety with minimal lighting impact.
2. **Water Guzzlers for Big Horn Sheep:** CPR proposes to work with the Nevada Department of Wildlife (NDOW) to provide and maintain water guzzlers at critical locations identified and agreed

upon by CPR, BLM and NDOW within and/or near to the project area. The purpose of these guzzlers would be to facilitate the use of the area near the CPW project by Big Horn Sheep and to facilitate migration corridors for Big Horn Sheep between the Castle Mountain National Monument southwest of the CPW and the South McCullough Wilderness area to the north of the CPW project.

- 3. Adjustments to the CPW Layout to minimize impacts on the Castle Mountains National Monument:** CPR has altered the proposed project layout to minimize the number of turbines and reduce visual impact on the Castle Mountains National Monument as well as the nearby Mojave National Preserve. We are willing to work with BLM staff to further adjust the CPW project layout to minimize potential impacts.

On behalf of Crescent Peak Renewables, LLC and the Crescent Peak Wind Project, Eolus North America requests that the BLM resume processing the Environmental Impact Statement under N-94470.
